CAPTAIN JAMES NEAL MARKER UNVEILED

The Captain James Neal Chapter has unveiled a granite marker at the gravesite of its namesake at Mount Olivet Cemetery in Parkersburg.

"Independence Day is the perfect time to unveil this marker," said Chapter President Ted Cox. "Like all of the patriots of the American Revolution, Captain James Neal risked everything for the cause of freedom. We owe our very existence as a nation to patriots such as him and we dedicate this monument to his memory. Americans must never forget what these brave patriots did for us."

The ceremony featured recognition of Captain Neal's lineal descendants. There were placements of wreaths at the grave, a musket salute, and a bagpipe presentation of "Amazing Grace."

Bob Enoch, president of the Wood County Historical and Preservation Society, said, "James Neal and his family immigrated here in 1785. He is credited with forming the first permanent settlement in what is now Wood County. It is absolutely essential that the community continue to identify, recognize and preserve historic sites such as this gravesite."
