7	ARTICLE I – NAME		
8	The name of this Society shall be THE WEST VIRGINIA SOCIETY OF THE SONS OF THE		
9	AMERICAN REVOLUTION.		
10	ARTICLE II – OBJECTS		
11	The objects of the Society are declared to be patriotic, historical, and educational and		
12	shall include those intended or designated to perpetuate the memory of the men, who, by their		
13	services and sacrifices during the War of the American Revolution achieved the independence of		
14	the American people; to unite and promote fellowship among their descendents; to inspire them		
15	and the community at large with a more profound reverence for the principles of the government		
16	founded by our forefathers; to encourage historical research in relation to the American		
17	Revolution' to acquire and preserve the records of the individual services of the patriots of the		
18	war, as well as documents, relics, and landmarks; to mark the scenes of the Revolution by		
19	appropriate memorials; to celebrate the anniversaries of prominent events of the war of the		
20	Revolutionary period; to foster true patriotism; to maintain and extend the institutions of		
21	American freedom and to carry out the purposes expressed in the Preamble of the Constitution		
22	of our country and the injunctions of Washington in his farewell address to the American people.		
23	ARTICLE III – MEMBERSHIP		
24	Section 1. Membership eligibility for the Society shall be the same as membership		

eligibility for the National Society. The President, Secretary and Registrar of the State Society shall constitute a Committee on Membership, and approval by them shall be approval by the State Society as required by the National Society. The President, Secretary, and Registrar of a chapter shall constitute a Chapter Committee on Membership, and approval by them shall be approval by the Chapter.

Section 2. If any applicant is deemed by a chapter, or State Committee on Membership, to be not personally acceptable to the Society, his application shall be referred to the Chapter of State Board of Management for its decision, which shall be by written ballot, three-fourths (3/4) being required to elect. Section 3. A member in good standing, upon his written application, shall be given by the Secretary a demit or letter of transfer to any other Society of the Sons of the American Revolution without payment of any fee for the demit. He may resume active membership by advising the State Secretary and remitting a fee for reinstatement and the current annual dues.

38 Section 4. A member of any other State society, in good standing, may transfer to and become a member of the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, or may 39 40 be permitted to hold dual Membership therein, without fee, upon written application and the 41 presentation of proper evidence of such membership. No dues shall be charged for the year in 42 which such transfer is received or Dual Membership is granted, provided such State and National 43 dues have already been paid to the transferring Society and the prescribed dues have been paid to the National Society. Thereafter, such member shall pay to the West Virginia Society the 44 45 annual dues assessed by said Society.

Section 5. The membership, for the purpose of determining the right to vote at any annual of special meeting, shall be classified as chapter members or members at large. Chapter members shall include persons who are members of the chapter. Members at large shall include all other persons who are members of the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution.

51 Section 6. Any man eligible under the Constitution to membership in the Society may, by 52 a vote of two-thirds of the members present at a regular meeting, be elected an Honorary 53 Member, provided that he shall have been recommended for Honorary Membership by the 54 Board of Management and notice thereof shall have been given members with the notice of the 55 meeting. Honorary members shall pay no initiation fee of dues and shall not hold office or vote.

56 Section 7. The official designation of a member shall be Compatriot.

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ARTICLE IV – OFFICERS

Section 8. A Life Active Membership may be provided by the State Society.

59 Section 1. The officers of the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution 60 shall be a President, a 1st Vice-President, a 2nd Vice-President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, a Registrar, a 61 Chaplain, a Chancellor, a Historian, and a Color Guard Commander, all of whom shall be elected at the 62 annual meeting and shall hold office for one year and until their successors have been elected 63 and qualified. The First Vice-President shall not be elected from the same chapter as the 64 President.

65 Section 2. The offices of Secretary and Treasurer, Secretary and Registrar, or Treasurer 66 and Registrar, may be combined and held by the same person. No person shall be eligible to serve as President of the West Virginia Society for consecutive terms, either full or partial,
aggregating more than two years. A person having served as President for two years shall be
ineligible for election to that office for a period of one year.

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ARTICLE V – BOARD OF MANAGEMENT

71 Section 1. The Board of Management of the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution shall be composed of all of the current State Officers, the National Trustee, 72 73 the current Presidents of the various Chapters, all living Past Presidents of the State Society, all 74 living Presidents-General of the National Society whose primary membership is in the West 75 Virginia Society and eight members of the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution, four of whom shall be elected at each annual meeting for a term of two years and 76 77 until their successors have been elected and gualified. The President shall be the Chairman of the Board, and the Secretary the Secretary thereof. Five members of the Board shall constitute 78 79 a quorum for the transaction of any business.

80

ARTICLE VI – COMMITTEES

81 Section 1. The President and one of the Vice Presidents designated by the President, the 82 Secretary, the Treasurer, and the Registrar, and two members of the Board of Management designated by the President, if required to make five members shall constitute the Executive 83 84 Committee, which, in the interim between meetings of the Board of Management, shall attend to all current business, subject to its action being reported and approved at the next succeeding 85 meeting of the board. The President shall be the chairman of the committee and the Secretary 86 the secretary thereof. A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction 87 88 of any business.

89 Section 2. The Credentials Committee shall be composed of the State Secretary, who 90 shall serve as chairman, and two other members appointed by the President.

91 Section 3. The President may appoint such other committees as he deems desirable from 92 time to time.

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ARTICLE VII – VACANCIES

94 Section 1. Vacancy in office, other than the President, by reason of resignation, death, 95 transferring to another state society or other cause, shall be filled by appointment by the President, 96 subject to the approval of the Board of Management at its next meeting. Resignations shall be 97 delivered to the Secretary by the resigning member. 98 Section 2. In case of a vacancy in the office of President, the First Vice-President 99 automatically becomes President for the unexpired term and the Second Vice-President 100 automatically becomes First Vice President for the unexpired term.

ARTICLE VIII – CHAPTERS

102 Section 1. In furtherance of the objects of the Society it shall be the duty of the Board of Management to encourage the formation of chapters throughout the jurisdiction. Upon the 103 104 petition of ten or more members residing in the same locality, the Board may, at its discretion, authorize the formation of a Chapter to be known as the CHAPTER OF 105 THE WEST VIRGINIA SOCIETY OF THE SONS OF THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION and fix its 106 jurisdiction. Such chapters may adopt a constitution and by-laws not in conflict with the 107 108 Constitution and By-Laws of the State Society. A copy of the constitution and by-laws so adopted 109 and all amendments which at any time may be made thereof shall be filed with the Secretary of 110 the State Society. Any person who shall be suspended, expelled or in any way lose his 111 membership in The West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution shall thereupon 112 cease to be a member of the chapter to which he may belong.

113 Section 3. A Chapter shall hold a minimum of four meetings each year, one of which shall be designated as the Annual Meeting for the election of officers. Any chapter may be adjudged 114 by the Board of Management as having forfeited its chapter for any one or more of the following 115 reasons: 1.) Failure to hold four meetings in any year; 2.) Lack of participation in West Virginia 116 117 Society events or activities; 3.) Failure to make return of and pay over monies due to the West 118 Virginia Society; Failure to make report to the State Secretary as required under Section 6. Of this 119 Article; 5.) Lack of membership enhancement activity; 6.) Misuse of funds; Inability of a Chapter to grow or function adjudged due to its internal structure; and 7.) Any other supported evidence 120 121 that the Chapter is not conforming to the objects and spirit of the West Virginia Society.

Section 4. Upon forfeiture of the charter of any chapter, all documents, books, moneys, and other properties belonging to and in possession of the chapter shall be delivered over to the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution to be taken and held until such chapter has been reinstated, provided, however, that if the chapter has not been reinstated within a period of two years, all such property shall become the property of the State Society and may be disposed of as the Board of Management shall deem wise and expedient.

Section 5. Prior to the convening of the annual meeting of the State Society, each chapter shall nominate as delegates to the National Congress, one member in good standing for each fifty chapter members, or part thereof, and shall duly certify such names to the State Secretary. In the event that any chapter fails to make and timely certify such nominations, it shall then be the duty of the delegates at the annual meeting and/or Board of Management, to fill the quota of delegates to the National Congress from the list of nominees and from other members in goodstanding.

Section 6. All chapters shall make such reports to the State Secretary as may from time to time be called for, and shall submit on or before March 20th of each year a report setting forth by name, the additions, transfer and deaths of its membership, a statement of the amounts paid to the Treasurer of the State Society, and such other matters as may be required by the Board of Management.

140 Section 7. The State President may appoint in any county in which no chapter exists a 141 County Chairman to promote the growth of membership in that county and to organize a Chapter 142 in such county.

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ARTICLE IX – MEETINGS

Section 1. the Annual Meeting of the Society shall be held on the fourth Saturday in April 144 at whatever place and hour shall be designated by the State Board of Management, provided, 145 however, that the Board of Management may fix the date for any Annual Meeting not more than 146 thirty days prior to or thirty days after said date. Special meetings of the Society may be called 147 148 at any time and place by the State President or the State Board of Management, five days written notice of all special meetings and ten days written notice of the annual meeting being mailed by 149 the State Secretary to all members of the Society. Ten members of the Society shall constitute a 150 quorum for the transaction of business at any regular or special meeting of the Society, provided 151 however that not less than three chapters shall be represented. 152

Section 2. The Annual Meeting shall be conducted in three sessions, referred to as the election
of officers, the banquet and installation of officers, and the business meeting. The order of
business at the annual meeting shall be:

186	Section 3. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President and shall be called		
187	by him when directed by the Board of Management, or upon written request of three chapters,		
188	properly signed by their officers, of similar request of twenty-five members at large. Ten days		
189	previous notice of the time and place of such meetings and the business to be transacted shall		
190	be mailed to the several chapters and to all members at large. No business not set forth in the		

be mailed to the several chapters and to all members at large. No business not set forth in thenotice shall be transacted at any special meeting.

192 Section 4. The right to vote at any annual meeting of special meeting shall be limited to 193 the delegates in good standing in attendance. Each chapter shall be entitled to one delegate for every twenty-five members of fraction thereof. The members at large shall be entitled to one 194 195 delegate for every twenty-five or fraction of their number. All officers and former Presidents of the West Virginia Society or the Sons of the American Revolution and the President or Vice 196 197 President of each Chapter shall be delegates-at-large. Prior to the convening of any annual or 198 special meeting, the names of the delegates to which each chapter is entitled, and the delegates 199 to which the members-at-large are entitled shall be registered with the State Secretary. It shall

be the duty of the Secretary, from the names so registered, to prepare the official roll of
delegates. No delegate may represent more than one chapter or any chapter of which he is not
a member.

Section 5. The Board of Management shall hold two regular meetings each year. The first shall be held during the months of September or October of each year, and the second shall be held not less than two weeks before the annual meeting of the Society. Special meetings may be called at any time by the President, or shall be called by the Secretary upon written request of five members of the Board. The hour and place of such meetings shall be determined by the President.

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ARTICLE X – NOMINATIONS AND ELECTIONS

Section 1. There shall be a nominating committee consisting of four members, two of 210 211 whom shall be elected each year for a term of two years. If practical, this committee shall be constituted so that at least two of the members are past state presidents and with not more than 212 one member from any one chapter. No member of this committee whose term is expiring shall 213 214 be re-elected to this committee. This committee shall annually nominate a candidate for each elective district office, for National Trustee, and for, when appropriate, for Vice President General 215 nominee. Its nominating report shall be mailed first class, hand delivered, or sent via email to 216 217 the secretary not less than 28 days prior to the date of the annual meeting. The secretary shall ensure that the report of the nominating committee is posted on the website of the State Society 218 219 and mailed or emailed to the current officers and chapter presidents not less than 21 days prior 220 to the Annual Meeting.

Section 2. Other nominations may be made, but only by written notice signed by ten members of the Society from three or more chapters. If any nominee shall be unable or refuses to serve, or shall be found to be ineligible, nominations to fill the office shall be made from the floor of the annual meeting.

225 Section 3. At any election, each delegate to the Annual Meeting present and in good 226 standing shall have one vote for each office to be filled. Voting shall be in the following manner:

a) Cumulative voting is prohibited.

- 228b) Election to an uncontested office may be effected by a supported motion and voice229vote.
- c) Election to a contested office shall be effected by ballot, unsigned and cast in person.
 and the results shall be tabulated and announced to the members before the close of
 the meeting.

233d) In the event no candidate for an office receives the majority of votes cast for that234office, a runoff election shall be held between the two candidates receiving the most235votes in the first election.

236 Section 4. The election of officers shall be held during the first session of the Annual 237 Meeting. Those officers elected shall assume their offices following the installation of officers 238 held during the second session during the Annual Meeting.

Section 5. The Board of Management shall nominate Delegates-at-Large to the National
 Congress, and upon election, the Secretary shall certify the name of such delegates to the ensuing
 Annual Congress of the National Society.

ARTICLE XI – FEES AND DUES

243 Section 1. Each application for membership in this Society shall be accompanied by an 244 initiation fee and dues in the amounts stated in the By-Laws.

Section 2. The following male applicants, provided they are eligible and acceptable to membership under the Constitution of this Society, shall be exempt from the payment of an initiation fee, but shall pay the prescribed fee for his certificate of membership and the annual dues as provided in the By-laws.

- (a) A son of a member of the Society, or the National Society of the Daughters of the
 American Revolution, who, at the time of such son's application is in good standing;
 or, if deceased, was at the time of his or her death, in good standing in such societies;
 if elected to membership before attaining the age of twenty-five years.
- (b) A male member of the National Societies of the Children of the American Revolution,
 the Children of the Revolution, or the Washington Guards, who, not later than one
 year after his twenty-first birthday, presents a valid transfer card to the Society.
- (c) A member of the General Society of the Sons of the Revolution, who, at the time ofapplication for membership, is in good standing in such society.

Section 3. Any member on active military shall be exempt from payment of annual dues.
His national dues shall be paid by the West Virginia Society and his state and chapter dues shall
be waived.

Section 4. All membership dues shall be based on the calendar year. Each Chapter shall collect such dues and remit the State and National dues to the State Treasurer not later than December 31st of the current year. All other fees collected in relation to the business of the Society shall be paid to the State Treasurer at the time of the transaction. Section 5. Any member who has been suspended for non-payment of dues of who has resigned from membership in the Society, may be reinstated upon written application and payment of such sum as shall be fixed by the Board of Management, and the reinstatement fee due the National Society. If, in the opinion of the chapter committee or state committee on membership, the applicant for reinstatement is not personally acceptable to the society, the application shall be referred to the State Board of Management for its decision, which shall be by written ballot, three-fourths vote being required to elect.

Section 6. The annual dues of chapter members shall be paid to the Chapter Treasurer and the annual dues of the members-at-large shall be paid to the State Treasurer. A final settlement for each and every member enrolled and not previously accounted for shall be made by the State Treasurer not later than December 31st of each year.

276 Section 7. Any member whose dues shall remain in arrears on December 31 shall be 277 moved to the inactive roll in accordance with the procedures of the National Society.

278 Section 8. Upon the transfer of a member-at-large to a chapter, the State Society shall be 279 entitled to the current year's dues of said member.

280 Section 9. In the event fees and/or dues are either waived, increased, or decreased by 281 the National Society, such act will automatically waive, increase, or decrease the amount 282 collected by the State Society, or its chapters for payment to the National Society.

283 Section 10. Applicants elected to membership within sixty days of the end of the calendar 284 year, and who have paid the initiation fee and annual dues prescribed herein, shall not be liable 285 for the payment of dues for the year following their admission.

286 Section 11. The annual dues paid to the State Society, or any portion thereof, may be 287 remitted by the State Board of Management in individual cases where the Board may deem such 288 action justified; however, no general remission of dues shall be made for any reason.

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ARTICLE XII – PROPERTY

Section 12. The Society shall pay any dues assessed by Central District.

Section 1. Any and all property(ies) whether the same be real, personal or mixed, including documents of whatsoever form, nature or kind, directly or indirectly, whether in the possession of the West Virginia Society or any of its Chapters or members shall be deemed solely owned by the West Virginia Society and controlled by the West Virginia Society Constitution and ByLaws. Any contrary individual claim of ownership of said property shall be void.

ARTICLE XIII- TRUST AND ENDOWMENT FUND

The Trust and Endowment Fund may be established by the State Society. It is a special fund to receive, administer and invest funds which may be donated to it. The donations may be donated for specific purposes according to the desires of the donor. It shall be administered by the Board of Management of the State Society. An annual report of the financial condition of the fund shall be presented each year to the Annual meeting of the West Virginia Society for the meeting's approval.

ARTICLE XIV – FISCAL YEAR

Section 1. The fiscal year of the West Virginia Society of the Sons of the American Revolution shall begin on the first day of January and end on the thirty-first day of the following December. The fiscal year of each Chapter shall be established by the Chapter.

ARTICLE XV – PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

The rules contained in the current edition of *Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised* shall govern the Society in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with this Constitution, the Bylaws of the Society, and any special rules of order the Society may adopt.

ARTICLE XVI - AMENDMENTS

Section 1. The Constitution may be amended by two-thirds vote of the members present and voting at an annual meeting of the Society, or a special meeting called for such purpose, provided the proposed amendment has been submitted in writing ten (10) days prior to the meeting day of such annual or special meeting and a copy thereof mailed to the Secretary of each chapter and to each member-at-large.

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ARTICLE XV - ADOPTION

319 Section 1. This Constitution shall be in force and effect upon adoption; and all Articles 320 and sections of Articles in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

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
